## Iowa

### CSBG NETWORK PARTICIPANTS

The Iowa State Office **administers CSBG funds to 18 Community Action Agencies** in 100% of IA counties

In Iowa, Community Action Agencies provided services to **324,070 low-income individuals.**

**64%** of families served by the CSBG Network lived below 100% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines

**30%** of families served in IA were in **severe poverty, below 50%** of the Federal Poverty Guidelines

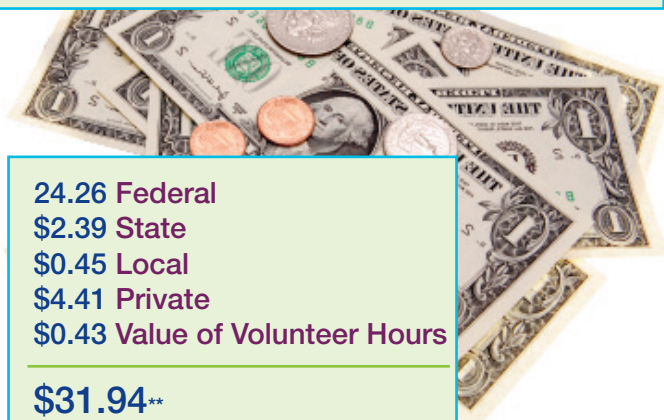
Nationally, **over 1,000 Community Action Agencies** receiving CSBG funding provided services to **15.9 million individuals with low-incomes.**

Nationally, of the **6.9 million families** served by the CSBG Network, **71.43%** were living below 100% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines.

### CSBG NETWORK RESOURCES

For every \$1 of CSBG, the IA Network leveraged **\$31.94** from federal, state, local, and private sources, including the value of volunteer hours\*

**\$6,906,756** in CSBG funds were allocated in support of local entities in Iowa.

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## CSBG PERFORMANCE OUTCOMES FOR IOWA

Services and strategies provided by the IA Network resulted in **335,738 outcomes for participants and communities with low incomes.**

### Outcomes Include:

**111,499 Employment**

Participants with low incomes in CSBG Network employment initiatives obtained supports which reduced or eliminated barriers to initial or continuous employment, acquired a job, increased their income, or achieved “living wage” employment and benefits.

**5,142 Economic Asset Enhancement and Utilization**

Households with low incomes increased their financial assets or financial skills.

**79,162 Child and Family Development**

Infants, children, youth, parents, and other adults participated in developmental or enrichment programs facilitated by the CSBG Network and achieved program goals.

**2,004 Independent Living for Vulnerable Populations with Low Incomes**

Vulnerable individuals with low incomes received services from the CSBG Network and secured or maintained an independent living situation as a result.

**119,078 Emergency Assistance**

Individuals and families with low incomes received emergency assistance from the CSBG Network.

**341 Community Opportunities and Resources**

Community opportunities or resources were improved or expanded for people with low incomes as a result of CSBG Network projects or initiatives, or partnerships with other public and private agencies.

**18,512 Community Empowerment**

Community members and people with low incomes mobilized to engage in activities that support and promote their own well-being and that of their community as a result of CSBG Network initiatives through maximum feasible participation.
