CSBG NETWORK PARTICIPANTS

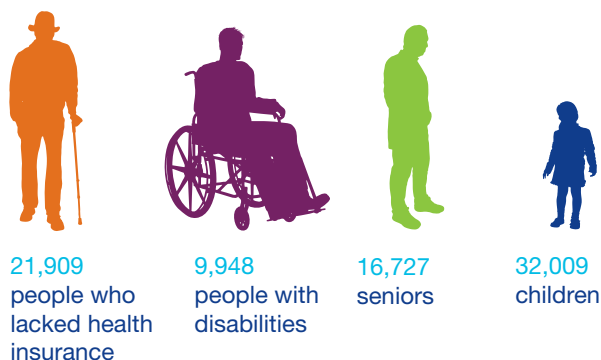
The North Carolina State Office administers CSBG funds to 35 Community Action Agencies in 96% of NC counties

In North Carolina, Community Action Agencies provided services to 133,810 low-income individuals.

86% of families served by the CSBG Network lived below 100% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines

Vulnerable populations served included:

43% of families served in NC were in severe poverty, below 50% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines

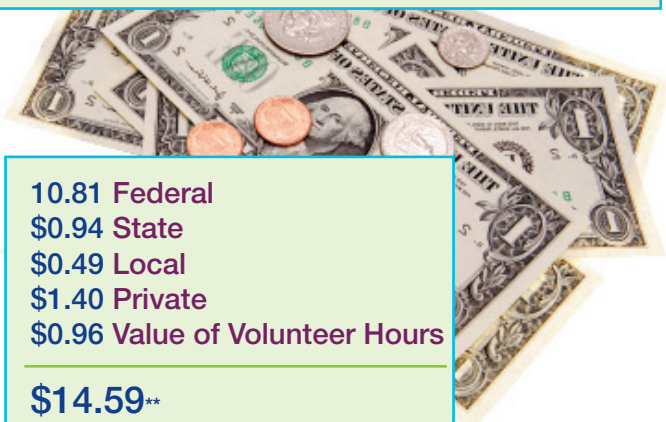


Nationally, of the 6.9 million families served by the CSBG Network, 71.43% were living below 100% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines.

Nationally, over 1,000 Community Action Agencies receiving CSBG funding provided services to 15.9 million individuals with low-incomes.

CSBG NETWORK RESOURCES

For every \$1 of CSBG, the NC Network leveraged \$14.59 from federal, state, local, and private sources, including the value of volunteer hours*



\$15,760,955 in CSBG funds were allocated in support of local entities in North Carolina.

The NC Network's non-CSBG funding totaled \$229,989,184.

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CSBG PERFORMANCE OUTCOMES FOR NORTH CAROLINA

Services and strategies provided by the NC Network resulted in **227,276 outcomes for participants and communities with low incomes.**

Outcomes Include:

39,006

Employment

Participants with low incomes in CSBG Network employment initiatives obtained supports which reduced or eliminated barriers to initial or continuous employment, acquired a job, increased their income, or achieved “living wage” employment and benefits.

10,952

Economic Asset Enhancement and Utilization

Households with low incomes increased their financial assets or financial skills.

65,449

Child and Family Development

Infants, children, youth, parents, and other adults participated in developmental or enrichment programs facilitated by the CSBG Network and achieved program goals.

18,367

Independent Living for Vulnerable Populations with Low Incomes

Vulnerable individuals with low incomes received services from the CSBG Network and secured or maintained an independent living situation as a result.

8,563

Family Stability

Participants with low incomes obtained supports which reduced or eliminated barriers to family stability through assistance from the CSBG Network.

57,536

Emergency Assistance

Individuals and families with low incomes received emergency assistance from the CSBG Network.

4,515

Community Opportunities and Resources

Community opportunities or resources were improved or expanded for people with low incomes as a result of CSBG Network projects or initiatives, or partnerships with other public and private agencies.

22,888

Community Empowerment

Community members and people with low incomes mobilized to engage in activities that support and promote their own well-being and that of their community as a result of CSBG Network initiatives through maximum feasible participation.
