## New Jersey

### CSBG NETWORK PARTICIPANTS

The New Jersey State Office administers CSBG funds to 24 Community Action Agencies in 100% of NJ counties

In New Jersey, Community Action Agencies provided services to 414,692 low-income individuals.

57% of families served by the CSBG Network lived below 100% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines

Vulnerable populations served included:

17% of families served in NJ were in severe poverty, below 50% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines



67,509 people who lacked health insurance



5,916 people with disabilities



64,201 seniors



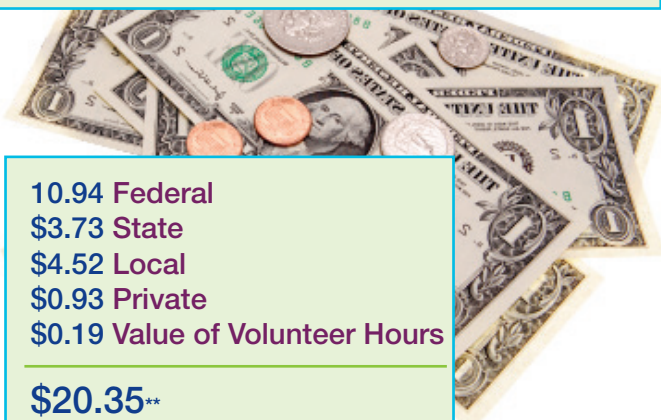
88,373 children

Nationally, of the 6.9 million families served by the CSBG Network, 71.43% were living below 100% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines.

Nationally, over 1,000 Community Action Agencies receiving CSBG funding provided services to 15.9 million individuals with low-incomes.

### CSBG NETWORK RESOURCES

For every \$1 of CSBG, the NJ Network leveraged \$20.35 from federal, state, local, and private sources, including the value of volunteer hours\*



\$15,225,887 in CSBG funds were allocated in support of local entities in New Jersey.

The NJ Network's non-CSBG funding totaled \$309,751,170.

## CSBG PERFORMANCE OUTCOMES FOR NEW JERSEY

Services and strategies provided by the NJ Network resulted in **821,679 outcomes for participants and communities with low incomes.**

### Outcomes Include:

274,613

#### Employment

Participants with low incomes in CSBG Network employment initiatives obtained supports which reduced or eliminated barriers to initial or continuous employment, acquired a job, increased their income, or achieved “living wage” employment and benefits.

18,875

#### Economic Asset Enhancement and Utilization

Households with low incomes increased their financial assets or financial skills.

114,677

#### Child and Family Development

Infants, children, youth, parents, and other adults participated in developmental or enrichment programs facilitated by the CSBG Network and achieved program goals.

42,750

#### Independent Living for Vulnerable Populations with Low Incomes

Vulnerable individuals with low incomes received services from the CSBG Network and secured or maintained an independent living situation as a result.

125,574

#### Family Stability

Participants with low incomes obtained supports which reduced or eliminated barriers to family stability through assistance from the CSBG Network.

220,012

#### Emergency Assistance

Individuals and families with low incomes received emergency assistance from the CSBG Network.

14,911

#### Community Opportunities and Resources

Community opportunities or resources were improved or expanded for people with low incomes as a result of CSBG Network projects or initiatives, or partnerships with other public and private agencies.

#### Community Empowerment

Community members and people with low incomes mobilized to engage in activities that support and promote their own well-being and that of their community as a result of CSBG Network initiatives through maximum feasible participation.
