## Mississippi

### CSBG NETWORK PARTICIPANTS

The Mississippi State Office administered CSBG funds to 18 Community Action Agencies in 100% of MS counties.

In Mississippi, Community Action Agencies provided services to 113,075 low-income individuals.

87% of families served by the CSBG Network lived below 100% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines.

Vulnerable populations served included:



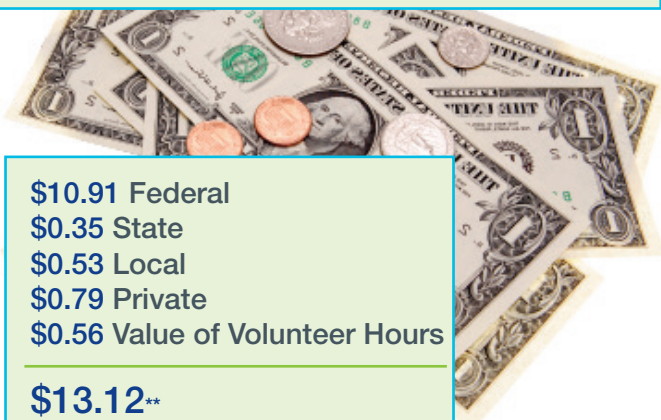
35% of families served in MS were in severe poverty, below 50% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines.

Nationally, of the 6.6 million families served by the CSBG Network, 82.6% were living below 125% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines.

Nationally, 1,026 Community Action Agencies receiving CSBG funding provided services to 15.6 million individuals with low-incomes.

### CSBG NETWORK RESOURCES

For every \$1 of CSBG, the MS Network leveraged \$13.12 from federal, state, local, and private sources, including the value of volunteer hours.\*



\$10,667,937 in CSBG funds were allocated in support of local entities in Mississippi.

The MS Network's non-CSBG funding totaled \$129,906,401.81.

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## CSBG PERFORMANCE OUTCOMES FOR MISSISSIPPI

Services and strategies provided by the MS Network resulted in **634,244 outcomes for participants and communities with low incomes.**

### Outcomes Include:

<b>91,656</b>	<b>Employment</b> Participants with low incomes in the CSBG Network employment initiatives obtained supports which reduced or eliminated barriers to initial or continuous employment, acquired a job, increased their income, or achieved “living wage” employment and benefits.
<b>23,267</b>	<b>Economic Asset Enhancement and Utilization</b> Households with low incomes increased their financial assets or financial skills.
<b>66,906</b>	<b>Child and Family Development</b> Infants, children, youth, parents, and other adults participated in developmental or enrichment programs facilitated by the CSBG Network and achieved program goals.
<b>66,438</b>	<b>Independent Living for Vulnerable Populations with Low Incomes</b> Vulnerable individuals with low incomes received services from the CSBG Network and secured or maintained an independent living situation as a result.
<b>65,295</b>	<b>Family Stability</b> Participants with low incomes obtained supports which reduced or eliminated barriers to family stability through assistance from the CSBG Network.
<b>20,704</b>	<b>Emergency Assistance</b> Individuals and families with low incomes received emergency assistance from the CSBG Network.
<b>293,628</b>	<b>Community Opportunities and Resources</b> Community opportunities or resources were improved or expanded for people with low incomes as a result of CSBG Network projects or initiatives, or partnerships with other public and private agencies.
<b>6,350</b>	<b>Community Empowerment</b> Community members and people with low incomes mobilized to engage in activities that support and promote their own well-being and that of their community as a result of CSBG Network initiatives through maximum feasible participation.
